Following the successful delivery of the Marriotts and Lonsdale Schools in Stevenage as part of the Hertfordshire BSF programme, Architecture PLB have been appointed by Balfour of a group room and WC's. Using this simple Beatty to deliver a number of additional schools projects throughout the county. The projects include extensions to existing primary schools to requirements of the school. For example, the accommodate increased pupil roll, new build secondary facilities, all-through Academies and two new primary Free Schools.

Working closely with Balfour Beatty and other members of the design team, we have developed a standardised approach to construction and detailing that has enabled greater efficiencies in both cost and time. This is allied with an ongoing review process that means both process and product can continue to be fine-tuned. Well proportioned classrooms with good levels of daylight and ventilation, fully integrated services, robust construction and low maintenance, attractive finishes are all aspects of the standardised approach, allowing each school to focus on aspects of the design that make their school unique.

The layouts for the primary school expansions are based on a simple, but well tested arrangement of pairs of classrooms either side building block, each project is configured to suit site specific constraints and the particular model was modified at Shepherd Primary School to include a clay tiled pitch roof, sympathetic to the context of the existing school buildina.

A palette of external and internal materials have been selected for the HSBP projects which provides the flexibility for the standardised model to be adapted to respond to the unique context of each site, and meet any specific requirements of the school, such as a particular school colour scheme.

In addition to our work on built projects we have produced feasibility studies for many other potential sites in order to help Hertfordshire County Council decide which are capable of expansion, identifying constraints and opportunities for each, and developing initial site layout options.
